

Make Personalized Projects Fast with Pre-Cuts + Powder Vibe

Creating fun personalized projects from wearable accessories to ornaments and home décor can be super-fast.

Supplies:

Fusible Pre-Cut Shape(s)

Powder Frit, Enamel or Mica Powder

Powder Vibe #91605

Optional: Additional Powder Vibe Tips

Finding(s)

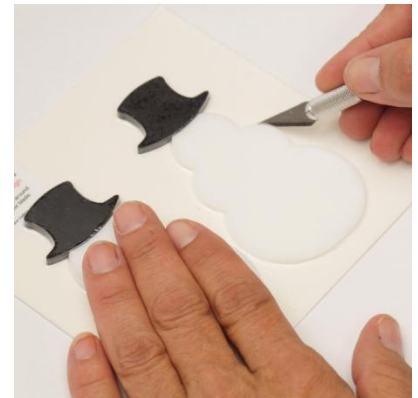
Optional: Fusible Glass in Matching COE

Process:

1. Make sure all glass you are using is the same coefficient of expansion (COE).
2. Carefully remove the pre-cut glass from all packaging and clean it with glass cleaner or rubbing alcohol.
3. Select a way to complete your project. Findings are available for everything from brooches to nightlights, boxes and more. You can even use pendant bails to easily attach a hanging loop to create sun catchers and ornaments.
Note: Be sure to consider the size of the pre-cut when deciding how you wish to complete it. Some pre-cuts make an excellent coat lapel pin, others would be over-size for this application.
4. Cut any background glass or additional layers needed for your project and clean.
5. Position glass on a prepared kiln shelf.



6. Load your Powder Vibe with enamel, mica powder or powder frit in the color desired. Holding the tip point down with a finger over the opening while using a funnel to pour powder helps make loading neat.

You can purchase additional tips in a variety of sizes and styles, which makes switching colors fast and easy. An optional metal plate is also available to keep filled tips tidy and organized.

Note: to ensure powders flow smoothly from tips, store filled tips in a low-humidity environment.

7. Use your Powder Vibe to write or draw intricate designs directly onto your pre-cut. The gentle vibration causes powders to flow smoothly and continuously. Strong magnets hold tips securely in place, but allow for quick tip changes for designs requiring multiple colors.

Note: if using mica powder it must be capped with glass.

8. Fire your project using an appropriate schedule.
9. Clean your fired project with water to remove any fiber paper or shelf wash residue.
10. Use E6000 or other adhesive to secure your art to the selected finding.
