

Fruit Inspired Platter

Create a plate good enough to eat! By utilizing pre-cuts and a few basics shapes, creating fruit inspired art has never been easier. Plate created by artist Dane Porter.

Tools & Materials:

Fusible Glass
Pre-Cuts
Glass pebbles
Bullseye GlasTac Gel Fusing Adhesive
Slumping mold of your choice

Materials for project shown:

White Opal #X200
Yellow Opal #X26072
Lemongrass Opal #X22672
Amazon Green Opal #X22674
Marigold Opal #X60355
Lipstick Red Opal #X60615
Dark Amber Transparent #X111
Fruit Slices Pre-Cut Assortment #X30417
Mixed Color Glass Pebbles™ Assortment #XPMIX– also sold individually
11-1/4" Origami Bowl Mold #81028



Instructions:

1. Clean white and yellow opal glass thoroughly removing any residue. Stack 12" x12" glass pieces, using the yellow glass as the bottom and white glass as the top.
2. Using Glassline Pens begin adding base details for fruit.
3. Cut glass into free form fruit shapes.
Note: We used Lemongrass for the lime and kiwi, Amazon Green for the pear, Lipstick Red for the strawberries and Dark Amber for the pineapple.
4. Begin arranging items. Glue glass pebbles, pre-cuts and shapes with Bullseye GlasTac Gel.
5. Add remaining details with Glassline Pens.
6. Place on prepared kiln shelf and fire to a full fuse. Then slump into desired mold.
