

# Modern Fused Menorah

**Celebrate the Festival of Lights with a custom fused glass menorah, incorporating tradition with modern touches.**

## Materials:

Fusible glass

1 rectangle (approximately 9" x 18" for design shown)

Assorted pieces in blue, white or other accent colors cut according to desired design

Shelf Paper

S-Curve or Multi-Curve Slumping Mold

3 Packages Aanraku Candle Cups (3 per package)

Triolyse Adhesive or other clear glue

Optional: Super Spray or Clear Coat Overglaze

## Instructions:


1. Cut a rectangle of glass and lay your design pieces on top.
2. Place on kiln shelf lined with shelf paper in kiln and full fuse. Notes: 1/8" thick fiber paper will help prevent air bubbles in the glass if your kiln shelf is not completely smooth. Apply Super Spray or Clear Coat Overglaze before firing, if desired, to ensure a gloss surface on the entire project. Suggested schedule for Bullseye Glass: 400°/hour ramp to 1450°F and shut off to cool.
3. Place the flat fired glass on slumping mold. Again, use 1/8" fiber paper. If you don't like the 1/8" thick texture, you can lay a piece of Thinfire on top for a smoother finish. Fire to slump. Suggested schedule for Bullseye Glass: 400°/hour ramp to 1350°F and hold for 30 minutes.

4. Clean the fused and slumped glass and stand on edge.
5. Cold work if needed for stability.
6. Apply adhesive to the candle cup and position it on the top edge of the fused glass base. Secure with masking tape while adhesive sets.
7. To create this Hanukkah menorah, the shamash is distinguished by placing it at the end, away from the other eight candle cups. Apply adhesive and position all candle cups according to your design.



Project can be modified to create a variety of fun and festive candle holder designs.
