

## Spectacular Stenciled Enamel Platters

You don't have to be a painter to be able to make fantastic projects with enamels. Utilizing stencils to create intricate details is easy.

### Tools & Materials:

Fusible glass or pre-cuts  
Glass Enamels  
Bowl Slumping mold of your choice  
Stencils from any craft store – or one you made yourself

### Materials for project shown:

Pre-made stencil  
Turquoise Blue Opal  
White Opal  
Turquoise Glass Enamel pen  
Blue Glass Enamel Pen  
12" Round Slumper Mold

### Instructions:

1. Cut 2 equal size pieces of glass or use pre-cuts to form your base.
2. Clean glass thoroughly removing any residue. Stack glass pieces.
3. Tape stencil down on top layer. Make sure stencils lay flat to avoid enamels seeping under.
4. Apply enamels using a brush, sponger or dabber. Apply 4-6 light coats allowing each to dry completely in between.  
*Delphi Tip:* Make sure enamels are shaken well before applying to ensure best results.
5. After enamels are completely dry gently remove stencil. If the enamels did bleed under the stencil, use a craft knife or tooth pick to carefully cleanup edges before firing.
6. Fire according to manufacturer's firing schedule included with enamels. Delphi's exclusive enamels used in this project can be fired to a full fuse, which will eliminate extra firings.
7. Slump if desired. Another option is to display the flat piece using a display stand.
